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CIGRE → By its nature of being a global, collaborative community, as well as by its global outreach through NCs, and CIGRE regional clusters, is best positioned to support and include Women in the energy transition momentum.

I trust CIGRE Women in Energy (WiE) has the potential to use global platforms and partnerships to act as a platform of international collaboration to include women in the on-going knowledge development programs;

Co-facilitate or in collaboration with other Woman in Energy forums, a platform provided by CIGRE to exchange knowledge, best practices from NC and Regional CIGRE, coordinate actions to ensure that women can also accelerate deployment of renewable resources

- **platforms that men can actively support and contribute to as well**

- **CIGRE through NCs can promote top female engineers and leaders in the Energy Transition initiatives and roles (including aligning policies across NCs)**

At the local level, CIGRE WiE can collaborate with professional associations, academia, non-governmental organizations (NGOs), policy institutes and think-tanks, to building a better gender-disaggregated evidence base.

Women in Energy Questionnaire

Recommendation:

CIGRE WiE to launch a Questionnaire to its members (first at regional level then broader), aimed at analyzing the women's perspective of energy transition:

Questions may include:

- **Are NC Countries' energy policies sufficiently inclusive?**
- **What is the percentage of women employed in Renewable energy vs. fossil-fuel sector?**
- **Are there are education and training programs targeting women in energy?**
- **What are the limitations and which are the opportunities?**
- **How can the energy transition be sped up?**

Can WiE help your countries' attempts for better gender inclusion in energy sector? (with the aim of inspiring women at all levels to accelerate the transition of our energy system)
